

Setting Default Email Handler

If clicking on our email links is not launching your email program you may need to set or reset your system's default email handler.

This seems to be a frequent problem for recent conversions to Microsoft Windows 10, where the default email handler has to be set separately from the default browser.

Here is the procedure for setting the default in Windows 10.

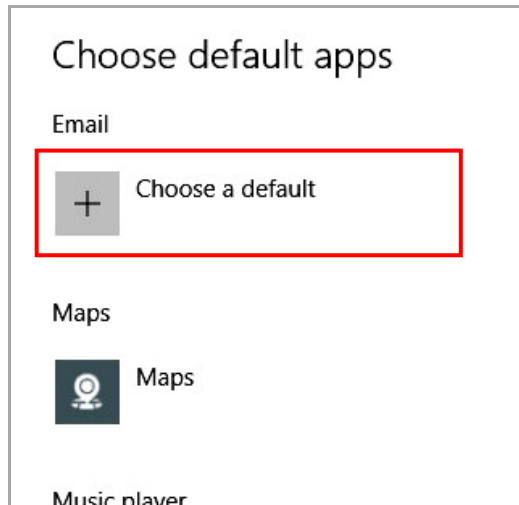
1 Click on Windows Start

2 Click on Settings

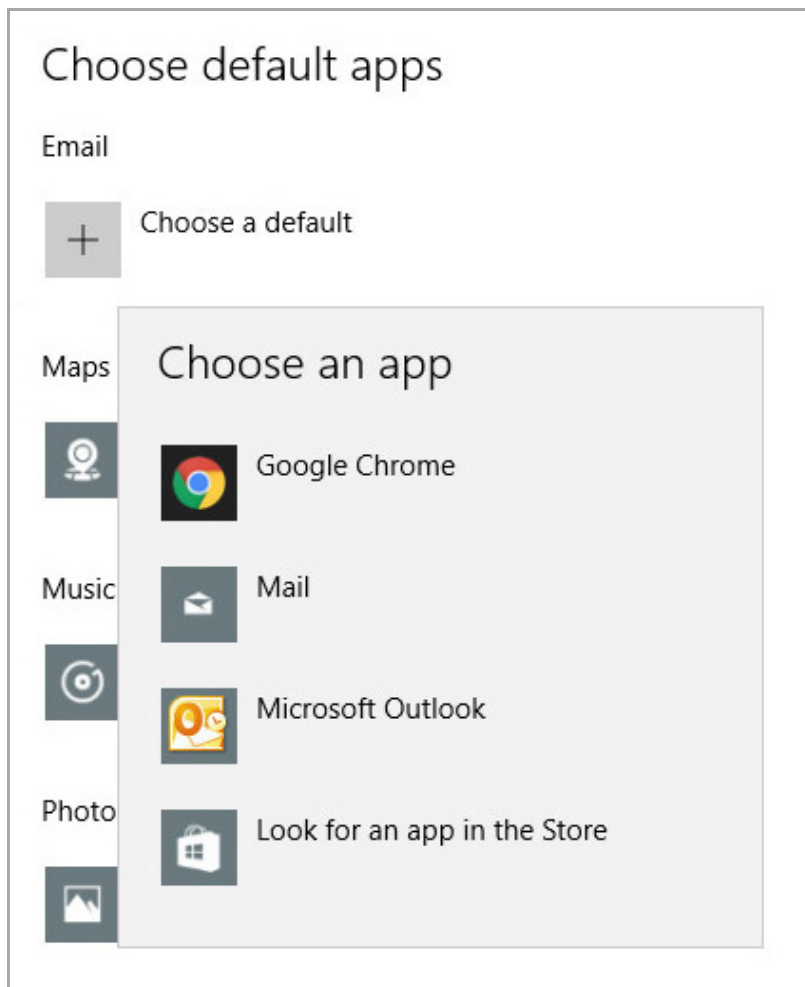
3 Select System

4 Select Default apps

5 Select Email
